As we enter Advent, we're eagerly preparing for the concert and children's service. We often become wrapped up in preparation; however, we need to always remember that Christmas is "Still All About Jesus."

We began a new Bible story book this week. Our theme is leaders. We've learned how God used Deborah and Samson to lead and guide His people. We are continuing to memorize the commandments and have learned up to 5th.

We've been studying word endings such as: adding -s, es, and -ing to verbs. We are also working on sounding out and spelling words with short i sound and the long a sound. Each grade is also working on learning vocabulary for new stories to be read.

In math we've covered counting by 10s to 100, counting dimes and pennies, and measuring using one inch tiles and inches on a ruler. First graders have begun learning the take away one subtraction facts.

We learned a little about Japan in Social Studies. We made a paper cup using origami and learned how to say hello, Konnichiwa, and good-bye, Sayonara, in Japanese.
